Summer School

Options (college prep and non college prep)

- AEF Summer School (fee based classes)
- Other WASC accredited summer school (nearby school districts or free independent Charter Schools)
- Online courses (must check with counselor for approval before signing up)
- Repeat the failed course during a regular school term in lieu of elective (does not apply to English)



Some courses meet Cal State/UC A-G requirements and some courses meet only high school graduation requirements.

Please check with your counselor if you need clarification on a course.

A maximum of 10 credits will be posted on the AHS transcript for summer school.

- Requests must be submitted 3 weeks before the deadline (not including holidays)
- Students need to complete a Request Log and Student Data Packet found in Naviance
- Contact your counselor for specific instructions

Online Policy

Prior to registering for an online course, students must obtain verification and approval from the Principal or designee that the course is essentially equivalent to the high school curriculum. An application for online course approval is available at the Counselor of the Day desk.

The following conditions must be met:

- Online instruction is UC approved
- Students provide a valid reason for taking the course
 - Course taken for enrichment
 - Course taken for elective credit
 - Course not offered at high school
 - Courses taken for make-up/grade improvement
- No more than 10 credits are granted in one subject area
- No more than 10 credits are granted per year
- Courses cannot be taken for acceleration











D and F grades on Transcripts



Grades are never removed from a transcript once they have been posted.

Students may remediate a D or F grade by repeating the class. The D or F grade is not removed from the transcript.

If the repeat class is the <u>exact</u> same class in which the D or F was earned, <u>only the higher grade</u> is used to calculate the GPA.

If the repeat class is <u>not</u> the exact same class, <u>both</u> grades are used to calculate the GPA.

Does UC average the SAT /ACT with Writing scores if an applicant has taken the test more than once?

No. For students who take the SAT or SAT with Essay, we use the highest combined score in critical reading, math and writing from the same test administration date. For students who take the ACT with Writing, we use the highest composite score from the same test administration date. If the student takes both exams, we will use the highest score from an examination date, regardless of the number of times a student took either exam.

Since AP courses are awarded extra honors points, if a student gets a D in an AP course, does that count as a C?

An honors grade point is not assigned when the grade earned is a D or F. The university awards the bonus grade point for Advanced Placement, International Baccalaureate, UC-approved honors courses, and UC transferable college courses in which a grade of C or higher is earned.

Private, Independent and Out of State College Admission Requirements

Generally, preparing for admission to the UC's/CSU's will prepare you for admission to most public and private colleges in the United States.

However, four-year college admission requirements may differ somewhat from school to school.


It is the student's responsibility to check each college website for specific requirements.



UC Comprehensive Review

Some of the 14 selection factors include:

- Academic grade point average in "a-g" courses
- Scores on the ACT plus writing or SAT Reasoning Test
- Academic classes taken beyond the minimum "a-g" requirements
- Quality of senior-year program
- Special talents, achievements and awards in a particular field
- Academic accomplishments in light of your life experiences








Community College Admission Requirements









- 18 years of age or
- High School Diploma

- No SAT required
- Complete freshman and sophomore years at a community college (general education requirements)
- Transfer to a 4 year public or private college to complete junior and senior years



NCAA Eligibility (Division I and II)

Complete a total of 16 NCAA core courses in the following areas:

4 years of English.

- 3 years of math (Algebra 1 or higher). 2 years of natural/physical science (including one year of lab science if offered).
- 2 years of social science.
- 1 additional year of English, math or natural/physical science.
- 4 additional years of English, math, natural/physical science, social science, foreign language, comparative religion or philosophy.





- Earn a minimum GPA of 2.3 in core classes
- Earn an ACT or SAT score that meets the sliding scale guidelines (scale available on NCAA website)
- •Use code 9999 to send SAT and/or ACT scores to NCAA.
- Must complete:

10 of the 16 core courses by the beginning of the senior year (7 of the 10 must be completed in English, math and science)

Grades in all "a-g" courses, even those that go beyond the number of courses required in each subject area, must be reported on the application and are used in the GPA calculation.

ELD Reclassification

**Please note: The following are transitional criteria while the state standardized testing is being updated to reflect the California Academic Standards **

All of the criteria below must be met to move out of the ELD program

- Overall score of Bridging level on the ELPAC
- C grade or higher in any English class
- GPA of 2.0 or higher in academic classes

We DO NOT recommend exiting before meeting the criteria!

If you want to exit the ELD program even though you do not meet the criteria you must follow the exit procedure * in order to be programmed into non-ELD courses in the Fall of 2019.

Chinese Placement Test


- Sign up for Chinese and pick up a survey and a testing date selection form when sitting with the counselor. All new students are initially placed into Chinese 1.

AP & Honors Classes

- ► Counselors recommend students enroll in no more than 3 AP and/or Honors classes.
- ► Most college students take 3 4 courses per semester. Taking 3 AP classes is the equivalent of a full-time college course load.
- ► Please take into account the time commitment your extra-curricular activities demand.
- No drops for AP or Honors courses will be allowed first semester.
- College qualifying grades of 'C' or higher both semesters are required


