

AUSD POLICY: ONLINE CLASSES

Prior to registering for an online course, students must obtain verification and approval from the Principal or designee that the course is essentially equivalent to the high school curriculum.

An application for online course approval is available at the Counselor of the Day desk.

The following conditions must be met:

Online instruction is UC approved

Students provide a valid reason for taking the course

- Courses taken for enrichment
- Courses taken for elective credit
- Courses not offered at AHS
- Courses taken for make-up/grade improvement

No more than 10 credits are granted in one subject area No more than 10 credits are granted per year Courses cannot be taken for acceleration



CSU/ UC ADMISSIONS A-G REQUIREMENTS



- a. 2 yrs. Social Science
- b. 4 yrs. English
- c. 3 yrs. Math Alg.1, Geom. and Alg.2 (UC & CSU/4 yrs. rec.)
- d. 2 yrs. Lab Science- 1 Biological, 1 Physical (UC/3 yrs. rec.)
- e. 2 yrs. World Language same language (UC/3 yrs. rec.)
- f. 1 yr. VPA Visual and Performing Arts
- g. 1 yr. UC approved elective



- UC/CSU schools allow courses to be repeated to make up a 'D' or 'F' grade
- Minimum GPA to apply to UC schools is 3.0 (subject to change)
- Minimum GPA to apply to Cal State schools is 2.0
- Make ups for 'C' grades are not accepted
- All applicants must complete 11 of the 15 "a-g" courses by the end of junior year



Minimum GPA for CSU is 211




Minimum GPA for UC is 3.0


- Only college prep (A-G) courses starting from the summer after 9th grade through the summer after 11th grade are included in calculating the GPA for eligibility.
- For selectivity, colleges may review all college prep course work taken.
- 9th grade students are taking college prep classes (English, Modern World History, math, science, world language, VPA). These classes must be passed with 'C' or higher to meet the A-G requirements.


